# Career Life Education (CLE) 12 Course Outline/Scope and Sequence

Introduction to Career Education:	A person's career is considered their "journey" through life, and the Career Education curriculum offers students the opportunity to pursue this journey in personally meaningful and goal-oriented ways. Career-life development with intent is the ongoing process of self-discovery, growth in competence, and learning from experiences in educational, work-related, and personal life contexts.  The Career Education curriculum supports students in becoming successful, educated citizens by helping them learn how to effectively manage their life journey toward preferred future possibilities. This area of learning requires students to identify and develop their personal interests, passions, and competencies. Students reflect on learning experiences in school and community, build confidence through their contributions, and explore multiple career-life roles and choices. The curriculum fosters lifelong learning, beginning in kindergarten and continuing through to graduation and beyond.

#### Let's Get Started:

- 1. Students visit <a href="https://www.myBlueprint.ca/sd83">www.myBlueprint.ca/sd83</a>, and click on SCHOOL Account Log In
  - Enter your SD 83 log in credentials and click Sign In.

NOTE: You should be participating in school-based Career activities/presentations or fieldtrips throughout the year (various Trades Spotlights and Post-Secondary Institute tours). When you have completed an activity, create a box in your "About Me" grade 12 portfolio, with the title of the specific activity. Add a reflection on what you have learned during this activity. Listen carefully to the morning announcement for information about upcoming Trade activities.

#### **OCTOBER**

NOTE: The **Learning Styles, Personality, Interests, Knowledge, and Motivations** assessments must be completed before a student can complete the Compatibility surveys. They need to be added to your About Me portfolio and reflections added for each.

# **ACTIVITY #1: Compatibility Assessment**

- 1. Select Portfolios from the tab menu in the home section.
- 2. Add a new portfolio (+ Add Portfolio) titled "About Me Portfolio" -Description Grade 12! This portfolio will allow you to showcase your interests, passions, goals, and career interest.
  - \*Each grade year students will create an About Me portfolio for that particular grade/year.
- 3. Select Who Am I? From the left-hand navigation menu on your dashboard.
- 4. Find your Occupation Matches. To do this, click Match Results, and scroll down to view which Occupations you have been matched with based on your answers to the first five surveys. You can filter by Education Level and Career Cluster to help you find what interests you. Click Load More to see more results if you wish.
- 5. Complete **Compatibility** surveys for at least three **Occupation Matches** and review your results. **"Favourite"** and add attractive opportunities to your **Portfolio** (Note: a red heart on the icon indicates "favourite").
- **6.** Select your **most attractive option** and click on the Occupation name to be taken to the **Occupation Planner**. Select the **Requirements** tab to view the requirements for this job. What level of education does this opportunity require?
- 7. Go to your **Grade 12** portfolio and find the box with your *most attractive* Occupation option. Write a brief **reflection** (How can I pursue this opportunity? How can I research this opportunity further? What steps do I need to take?).

- 1. Select Home from the navigation menu on the left-hand side of your screen. Then select the tab Goals.
- 2. Add ONE (1) Academic Goal (short term, term 1) and include an Action Plan for how you intend to achieve it. This can be around learning a new skill or to improve on a specific subject area.
- 3. Add this academic goal to your About Me Portfolio.



- **4.** Add **ONE (1) Other Goal (short term)** and include an Action Plan for how you intend to achieve it. This can be about anything else in your life that you would like to improve on.

- **5.** Take a picture of your Core Competency Reflection Sheet, which you will complete with your classroom teacher, upload it!

- 4. In the navigation menu, select **FAVOURITES** to review your selected opportunities (click on the **Apprenticeships/Programs or Workplaces** tab). Click the three grey dots to the right of the opportunities you favourited today, select the **Compare** button, and then click the blue **Compare** button at the top of the screen to view the opportunities side by side.
- **5.** Consider and compare the following, also complete the attached Post secondary Program worksheet attached....
  - a. Location
  - b. Program Length
  - c. Tuition cost
  - d. Is there residence/cost?
  - e. Admission requirements
  - f. Related Occupations
- **6.** In the navigation menu, select **FAVOURITES** and rank your top three post-Secondary opportunities by clicking and dragging them into the first, second, and third place spot.
- 7. Add your recently "favourited" opportunities to your portfolio (About Me Portfolio, grade 12) by clicking on the three grey dots to the right of the opportunity title and selecting the **Add** button.
- 8. Add a **reflection** to each of the three boxes in **your About Me Portfolio** (What is it about these opportunities that interests me? Why do I want to pursue this opportunity? What are the pros and cons of each one?).

- **4.** Add **ONE (1) Other Goal (short term)** and include an Action Plan for how you intend to achieve it for Term 3. This can be about anything else in your life that you would like to improve on.
- 5. Add this goal to your About Me Portfolio.

NOTE: You will write a brief reflection about your goal achievement progress at the end of each term.

# **ACTIVITY #2: Scholarship Resumes**

- 1. Select Work from the navigation menu on your dashboard, click on Resumes.
- 2. Review the **Resume Guide** to learn more about effective resume building. Select **Back to Resume** in the top right corner of your screen to return to building your resume. Also, research online, about Scholarship resume writing. A resume for a scholarship is a document focusing on your education and academic achievements. It includes your career objective and presents your skills and professional experience. It also highlights your achievements and awards. Your objective should give the reader a clear indication of your plans for the year after graduation. Another big focus is your volunteer activities.
- 3. Create a new resume or add to your resume from grade 11. Reminder you may want to title your resume for scholarship differently. If you haven't already, update or add your Contact information; fill in the Objective, Education, Volunteer Experience, and any other sections you feel you need. When you print your resume, it will only print what you have populated.
- 4. You can "switch" the order of appearance of your sections....your objective should be first, followed by volunteer work, awards, skills, hobbies, work experience. References belong at the end. If you are unsure, google some examples. Your objective can be a paragraph...remember that it should be very clear what your path post secondary is going to be. Remember this is a Scholarship resume and doners are wanting to know how their money will be spent; are you a good investment for them?

HOMEWORK: Print a copy of your resume and hand it in to the Career Centre. Be sure the resume you hand in is one that is truly useable. Reminder, the scholarship resume will go on your poster board for the Scholarship Tea and many scholarship applications require a copy of one. Be sure you proofread!



#### MARCH

#### **ACTIVITY #1: Thank You Letters**

- 1. Select Work from the navigation menu on your dashboard, click on Cover Letters.
- 2. Select the **Cover Letter Guide** and review the **Guidelines and Tips** to learn more about effective Cover Letter building.
- 3. Write a **Thank You letter** in cover letter format to the donor of a scholarship that is offered at ALF. Stop by the Career Centre if you are unsure of who to address your letter to; however, there is a PAC scholarship and also an A.L. Fortune Staff Bursary so you could address to either.
- 4. Select Cover Letters in the "Work" section from the navigation menu. From here, complete all the fields: Your Information, Recipient (who the scholarship is from), Information, Paragraph 1 (thanking them for the opportunity), Paragraph 2 (your future plans and how "their" money will be spent), Paragraph 3 (thanking them specifically for your award), and Closing (regards, and your name). Check for spelling mistakes and be professional with your grammar.
- 5. Click Preview Cover Letter in the bottom right corner of the screen to review formatting options. When you're satisfied with the presentation, save it to your About Me grade 12 portfolio.

**HOMEWORK:** Print a copy of your Thank You letter and hand it in to the Career Centre.
